You are invited to join us as we explore a few of the most historic houses in Denver.

We will tour the beautiful home of the famous Titanic survivor, Molly Brown. This house was built in 1880 and was purchased by her husband, J.J. Brown, in 1894. The history of this home and of Molly Brown's life is fascinating.

Then we will enjoy lunch at the Grant-Humphreys Mansion.

We will be served high tea, consisting of 3 courses:
fruit and scones, finger sandwiches and dessert.

This magnificent home was built in 1902 for James B. Grant after his term as the 3rd Governor of Colorado.

The final place we will visit is the Byers-Evans House Museum. William Byers, publisher of the Rocky Mountain News, built this house in 1883 and sold it to William Evans in 1889. Mr. Evans was a officer of the Denver Tramway Company. Amazingly, this house remained in the Evans family until 1982, when it was donated, **fully furnished**, to the Colorado Historical Society.

We are going to have a great time and we want you to be a part of it !
